Pastoral Reflections

The Reverend David F. Peters, Minister

May has arrived! The other day Susan and I were walking around the Parsonage grounds looking at flowers that were starting to bloom and what work we need to do to get them to come into its full potential of beauty.

As we walked Susan was pointing out the various Hostas that are spreading and maybe we need to transplant them and spread them out. Then she pointed out one little Hosta leaf sprouting out from between all other plants. It was hard to notice unless Susan pointed it out. It got me to reflect about that budding plant.

It got me to think about how in the midst of all the other plants, almost unnoticed, was a plant working and striving to be whole, to make a place in the world as creation of God.

We see many times great achievements celebrated all around. Acceptances to

college, the promotion, the new job, personal achievements of fame, etc...

But for some, it is like that little Hosta plant stalk, unnoticed most times, striving and working to just get above the surface. We may strive some days just to lift our heads from the pillow, or get out of bed,

or move around for the day. And for this others may not even notice, and maybe even care...

But today, I want to celebrate those small victories. As our denomination's motto goes, "Not matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here!," I understand that the impetus for this motto was to be a church that is inclusive of people who may feel that they don't have it all together faith-wise or that they come from a history of discrimination because of sex, race or sexual orientation. And I agree with that, but I would expand it further to include the idea that we have not all arrived at the place that has it all together. I work to have a church community that celebrates that everyone is on a journey. We may be able to get ourselves out of bed most mornings and even on a Sunday, come to the church to worship together with others. But I want you to know that I and I hope the congregation sees and acknowledges that everyone one of you is valued and that we celebrate the small (and large) victories that make acknowledge and up your life.

I seek to know each of you and your challenges as well as your victories. If I need to be reminded. please do so because I value you for who you are no matter where you are on life's journey.

A guiding principle of Simply Smiles is to

provide bright futures by empowering the communities we are privileged to work with. The transfer of ownership and operations of our children's village to the Lakota people exemplifies our dedication to that commitment and aligns with our values of sustainability, self-determination, and respect for Indigenous sovereignty.

The Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe is now positioned to be one of the few tribal nations with their own Native child welfare program.

Transferring a "turnkey" child welfare facility to the Tribe marks the pinnacle in our 15-year partnership. We want to express our deepest gratitude to everyone who supported the monumental effort to create our first-of-its-kind children's village on the Reservation. Your time, hard work, unwavering dedication, and incredible generosity have made this leap forward possible for the Cheyenne River Sioux community.

The journey to create the Reservation Children's Village took us into uncharted territory, challenged us, and demonstrated the power of genuine partnership with a community in need. While this marks the successful end of one chapter, it also is the beginning of the next one for Simply Smiles. We will carry forward the strength gained and lessons learned as we continue to provide bright futures and redefine how society's most vulnerable children are cared for.

The Roxbury Church went to LaPlant, SD CRST On 5 different occasions, as well as once to their site in Mexico.

While our in-person participation on the CRST in SD is now ending, we still will support Simply Smiles as one of our beloved Mission Partners. We are hoping to have Bryan Nurnberger come and speak during worship in late June.
